Farewell Given to Valparisian Class



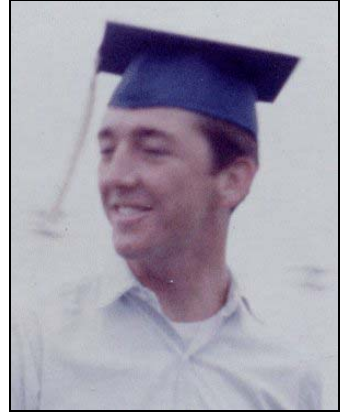
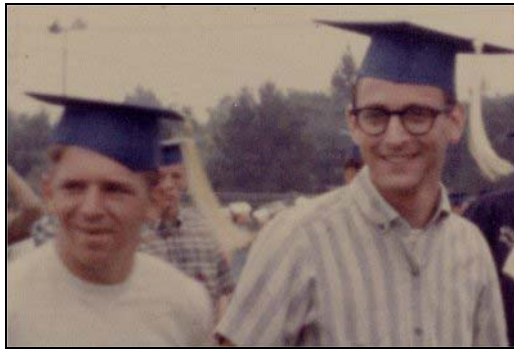

Graduating students will march to their seats to the traditional music of "Pomp and Circumstance" played by Reseda

High's orchestra, under the direction of Mr. Leonard Gagliardi. When the students are seated, Harland Moidel, president of the class, will then lead the Valparisians, guests, and parents in the Pledge of Allegiance and Salute to the Flag. Harland will also welcome the special guest speaker, parents, faculty and fellow graduating students.

Before the presentation of the graduating class by Mr. Galen Young, Senior coordinator, two selections by the A Capella Choir will be sung directed by Miss Hindee.

Following the acceptance of the class speech and presentation of the diplomas by Mr. Naumann, the class roll for the 1966 Summer graduating class will be announced. Iris Boyd, vice-president of the class, will give the acceptance speech for the diplomas.

The Valparisians will close commencement exercises with the singing of the Alma Mater and the orchestra will then play the recessional march, "The Victors." This will conclude three years of high school by the Class of 1966, the Valparisians.
