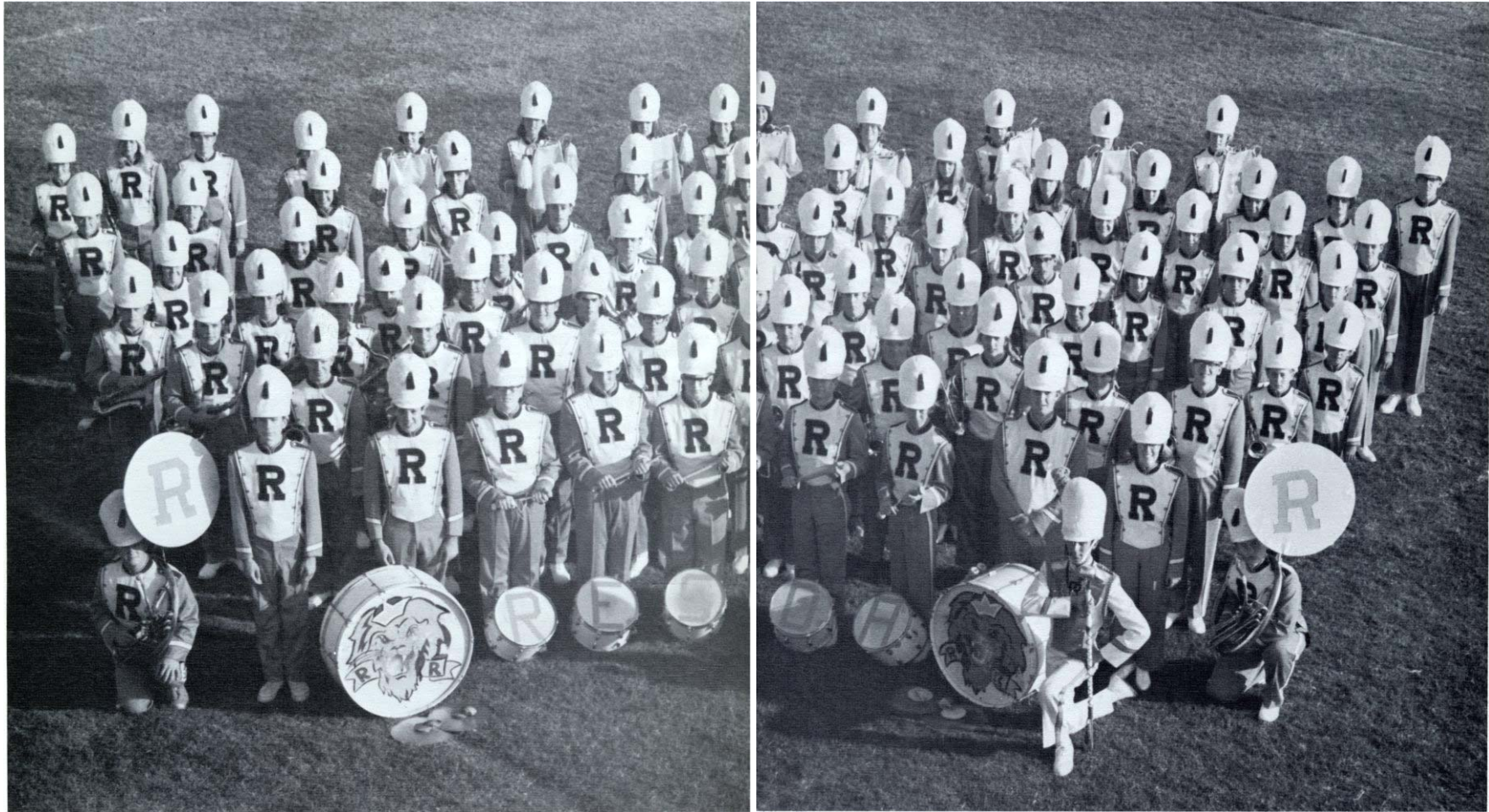


## The Reseda High School Marching Band, Winter 1966



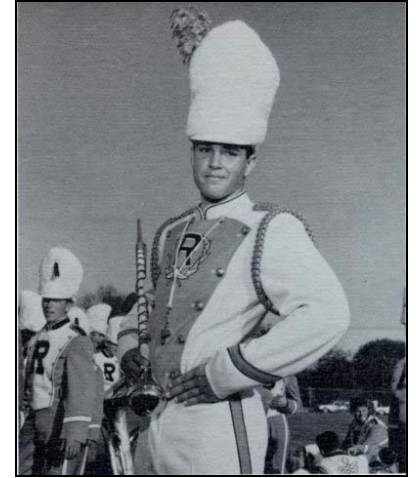

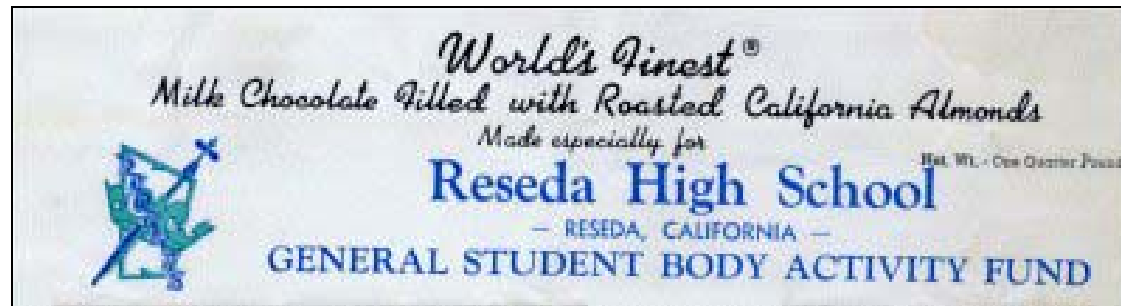
1966 Drum Major: Scott Mitchell
